## 1. Gateways to our Economy

- Full appropriation of Harbor Maintenance Trust Fund
- Provide input to WRDA 2020 Implementation Guidance
- Pursue Federal funding for ports
  - Port Infrastructure Development Program, PIDP
  - Infrastructure for Rebuilding America, INFRA
  - Rebuilding American Infrastructure with Sustainability and Equity, RAISE
  - Consolidated Rail Infrastructure and Safety Improvements, CRISI
  - Port Security Grants
- Classify Port Workers as Essential Employees















### 2. Sustainable Investments

Data driven policy for port infrastructure means long term cost savings Ports are front lines for climate change impacts and greenhouse gas emission reductions

- Develop AAPA State of Freight V, focused on resilient and smart ports
- Pursue appropriations for new Marine Transportation System Emergency Relief Act, MTSERA program
- Continue and increase flexibility in EPA's Diesel Emission Reduction Act, DERA program
- Include extreme weather events in Homeland Security Plans















## 3. Security at our Gateways

Ports support Customs and Border Protection, CBP's Federal responsibility for cargo inspection and duties collection

Ports concerned with CBP staffing levels and demands for facilities

- Require CBP define 'necessary' cargo inspection facility requirements
- Engage in right-sizing CBP facility technical standards
- Explore options to develop a fund for CBP facilities
- Fund resource needs to hire additional CBP officers and equipment (radiation portal monitors) to assure safe and efficient freight movement
- Pursue oversight by Homeland Security Inspector General and General Accountability Office as necessary















### 4. Calmer Seas in International Trade

Pursue Free, Fair and Rational international trade

Avoid alienating our trade partners and turning away from global consumer markets, 80% of which are outside the U.S.

- Eliminate tariffs that artificially suppress trade and raise prices for American consumers. Tariffs are taxes on American consumers
- Advocate to reform and resuscitate the World Trade Organization
- Include an Environmental Goods Agreement in any environmental tax proposals to assure a level playing field for green economy transitions
- Seek Congress renew the Trade Promotion Authority to expedite approval and implementation of trade agreements















## 5. Information Technology and Digitization

Virtual connectivity informs physical connectivity, and visibility means more efficient supply chains.

- AAPA technical and policy committees establish common ground and a timeline for Port Community Standards (PCS)
- Agree on PCS that are interoperable, scalable, secure and have common standards
- Set a national framework for effective and enforceable data security
- Pursue resources for increasing digitization of supply chains
- Protect and back-up the Global Positioning System
- As industry digitizes, support increases in cybersecurity funding
