Navigation Mission

To provide safe, reliable, and efficient waterborne transportation systems (channels, harbors, and waterways) for the movement of commerce, national security needs and recreation.

The Color of Your Money

- Accelerated Funds
 - Non-Federal Sponsor provides funds early, within total cost-share amount.
 - Credit given only if additional federal funds are provided.
- Advanced Funds
 - Non-Federal funds provided as an advance of the federal share or in the absence of federal funding
 - Potential for repayment or credit



The Color of Your Money

- Contributed Funds
 - Non-federal funds provided in excess of required cost-share amount
 - ► No repayment or credit






Contributed Funds

- Section 111 of the FY 2012 Energy & Water Appropriation Acts amended, 33 USC 701(h).
- Guidance issued in April 12, 2012 memo.
 - Funds are voluntarily provided above statutory requirements
 - No repayment, but will refund unobligated contributed funds
 - Congressional Notification required
 - Can be accepted for planning, design, construction and O&M



Contributed Funds Flowchart






Contributed Funds Flowchart

Section 408 Permits

- Modifications that go beyond the normal O&M
 - Includes modifications to channels, structures, or placement sites
- Can be associated with Section 404/10 permit actions.
- Examples: utility crossing, dock/wharf that would otherwise encroach on the federal project, sediment traps, advanced maintenance



Requesting a 408 Permit

1. A written request by the non-Federal interests for approval of the project modification/alteration.

Step 1 – Talk to your local USACE District

- 8. Any Administrative Record.
- 9. A discussion of indirect effects.
- 10. A discussion of E.O. 11988 Considerations.
- 11. Technical Analysis.
