


Program Overview

- Who got involved?
 - Marinas and yacht clubs from Dana Point to Chula Vista and Industry Associations.
- How was the program developed?
 - By understanding the issues and collaborating with other programs from other states





The Alliance

The Clean Marinas Program is a partnership of private marina owners, government marina operators and yacht clubs.





Mission Statement

The Clean Marinas Program is an ongoing endeavor, by a marina industry alliance, determined to provide environmentally clean facilities and protect the states' coastal and inland waters from pollution through compliance of best management practices.

CMP Administration

- Train and establish review teams and then certify marinas and yacht clubs when asked...all voluntary!
- Update the program manual content as needed
- Maintain website and communications with stake holders, government entities and the public
- Re-certify each marina or yacht club every five years



Review Teams and Team Trainers

Three-person teams visit marinas, complete the checklists and score sheets, and, if criteria is met, recommend that the marina or yacht club earn the Clean Marinas Program designation





Review Process and Benefits

- Marina Review: 3-4 hours
- Cost: \$750 per certification
- Designation: certificate and website listing
- Flag, burgee and decals for display at facility
- Eligible for marketing as "Clean Marinas Program Certified"

Example: Mandatory Additional

Divide total points needed into actual score to obtain percentage.

- 122 Marinas & yacht clubs as of Dec 2013 and 68 Recertification's
 - 89 Salt Water Marinas & Yacht clubs
 - Paradise Village Marina, Puerto Vallarta
 - 1 Southern California Lake Marina
 - 16 Northern California Lake marinas and 4 Delta marinas
 - 3 Military-operated marinas
 - 5 Marinas on Lake Mead and Lake Mohave

- They have demonstrated they are encouraging boaters and employees to use Best Management Practices to protect the environment and prevent or reduce pollution in our state's waters. They have been designated a "Clean Marina."

- Encourage the sharing of our program content with other states and countries.


